 - Mission and vision
 - Commitment to enhancement and engagement with EQA

Reviews in second cycle published

- Four institutional reviews (IWRs; Sep 2019 – Sep 2021)
- Two judgments
 - Standards of degrees and awards
 - Quality of student learning experience
- One review had a negative outcome
 - Action plan and Board follow-up
- Some challenges identified in first cycle appear to persist, e.g.,
 - Governance structures and processes
 - Formal and comprehensive programme review
 - Information/data management

Reviews in second cycle published

- Subject-Level Reviews (SLRs)
 - Institution-led reviews of individual units (departments)
 - Areas of coverage:
 - Standards of degrees
 - Student learning experience
 - Management of research
 - No judgment, but involvement of external experts
 - Full report sent to Quality Board (summary published)
 - Form part of evidence base for institutional reviews
 - Meant to capture seven years of ongoing programmatic and departmental reviews

Research management in second cycle


- Covered in both IWRs and SLRs
- Some universities have clear research strategies at institutional level
- Some departments have clear research strategies
- Historical boundaries and traditions may be hindering development of
 - Explicit research strategies
 - Interdisciplinary research agendas
- Is “strategy” and “evaluation” antithetical to academic freedom of individual staff members?

Commissioned reviews

- Programme-level review of Police Studies (completed)
- Accreditation of doctoral studies (completed)
- Impact assessment of *Icelandic Research Fund* (ongoing)
- Review of strategic management at a university-affiliated research institute (ongoing)

Relocated secretariat office

- Made possible by revised rules on QA in higher education (December 2018)
- New website
- More independence
- Less administrative support

Success stories

- Two advisory bodies
 - Quality Council
 - Common definitions of key data for informal benchmarking
 - Webinar on internationalisation as a driver of quality
 - Ongoing sharing of resources
 - Research Evaluation Advisory Committee
 - Webinar and in-person workshop on research evaluation
 - Taking a leading national role for dialogue on research management and evaluation at a critical time
- Online meetings offer flexibility and quicker response times

Challenges

- COVID-19
 - Reviews postponed and then moved online
 - Backlog (five reviews in 10 months)
 - More use of contracted services
 - Board meetings online (no Board members in Iceland for 18 months)
 - Lack of local presence, resources and capacity felt more acutely
- Relocated secretariat office in 2020
 - Secretariat remains a “one person operation”
 - Less administrative support
- Legal framework in need of further revision
